Her showroom provided the perfect accessory for the well-stored wardrobe, and her storage tips will help you keep your wardrobe investments looking showroom new.

**DON'T STRESS** It's really quite easy to build a basic wardrobe when you break the task into three manageable categories: Business Executive, Business Casual and Weekend Wear. Then, Tankpinou says you should gradually aim at acquiring the following:

# FOR THE BUSINESS EXECUTIVE

# SUITS W

A solid dark suit (brown or black) A solid grey suit A patterned suit

# SHOES M

At least three pairs of shoes in the following colors: black, brown and tan. (Having a tan pair comes in handy for those business casual looks, and they also look great with dark blue jeans.) A set of shoe polish accessories

# TIES WWW WWW

At least three regular ties in the following colors: black or navy blue, red, and any other fall color such as green, pink or purple.

One bow tie that you can rock

# BELTS

Black, brown and tan

#### SOCKS

A combination of dark (black, brown, navy blue) and light colors. Tankpinou stresses that you should always avoid wearing athletic socks in this category.

#### POCKET SQUARES

While Tankpinou says they are a matter of personal preference, you would make a better impression on important office occasions by adding one. Solid colors are a safe option to start with.

#### WATCH

It is best to start with something classy yet flat enough to easily go under your shirtsleeves at the wrist.

#### **CUFF LINKS**

These are also a matter of preference, but Tankpinou recommends you have one pair that can be worn on certain occasions such as a high profile or board meeting. Keep in mind that they should be low profile when it comes to bling-factor and should match the metal of your watch.

#### COATS

One trench coat for fall. One winter coat. One winter jacket.



SHIRTS At least one shirt





#### BRIEFCASE OR ATTACHÉ CASE

This really is an important part of a business executive look, as it indicates that you mean "business." Acceptable options here include fine leather, hard shell or even aluminum if you want to make a strong statement.







# FOR BUSINESS CASUAL LOOKS

#### BLAZERS W

A navy blue blazer A grey blazer, which is very useful and works well with a dark pair of jeans

#### SWEATER

At least one cardigan sweater that can be worn over a dress shirt for the colder months

# SHIRTS WWW

The same dress shirts (white, blue, pink and lavender) from your executive selection A couple of patterned shirts for a great blazer and no-tie look!

#### PANTS M

A couple of solid-colored chino pants One or two regular solid-colored pants (the same suit pants from the suits of your business executive selection) A couple of pairs of jeans-at least one dark blue wash is an absolute must! (Make a great statement by wearing tan shoes with this look.)

#### BELTS M

Belts appropriate for jeans in black, brown and tan







# 8 Great Storage Suggestions

When it comes to storing your wardrobe, no one knows better than The Closet Lady, Ellyn Elstein. Here are her Top 8 storage tips:

- Create a man cave drawer for yourself that you can empty your pockets into at the end of the day. This also works as a quick catchall for watches, cuff links, etc. This can be a locking drawer, if desired.
- 2. Ties can be rolled and stored in a divided drawer. This makes them look better, longer and extends the life of the tie. The more traditional way is to hang them on telescoping tie racks.
- Belts can be rolled or hung and stored, as well. They should have their own special and easyto-access space with great visibility.
- 4. Pants can be hung on the lower part of your closet's double hanging area if folded in half over a hanger. You will require more space between the rod and the floor, however, if you are a stickler for hanging them long from the cuff.
- 5. Shirts, suits and sport jackets should be hung on the upper rod and organized by color.
- 6. Drawer storage is for underwear, socks, swimwear, workout clothes and pajamas. Shoes and sweaters should be shelved and everything else should be hung.
- 7. Drawer storage can also be used for baseball caps and a variety of other casual hats and caps when you add storage bins.
- 8. Telescoping valets make practical accessories for the active businessman who wants to have his attire close at hand and ready for the next day or for travel. This is also a great place to hang dry cleaning when it first comes back from the cleaners, waiting for transfer to nicer hangers and its true place in the closet.
